The Japanese Society of Internal Medicine (JSIM) was formed in 1903, and the ACP in 1915. It was not until 2002 that, with the endorsement of the JSIM, that the ACP Japanese Chapter – the first international chapter for the College outside of the Americas – was founded.

In this brief talk we will highlight some of the major accomplishments of the Chapter through the lens of the College. We also will examine the values, mission and goals of the ACP today, and its most important activities, particularly as they pertain to internists worldwide. This examination will demonstrate the College's commitment to advancing clinical care and education, while enabling internists – both generalists and specialists – to find satisfaction and success in their careers.
